\$10.00 entry fee per artist regardless of the number of pieces.

Each member can bring up to 4 pieces of artwork.

An artist may have more than one piece of art chosen.

We will hire a juror and pay them \$100.00. They will critique the ribbon winners and more if there is time after the judging.

Artwork need not be framed for judging in July, but must be gallery ready in September (framed respectably with wires) or the Angel will not accept it. Each painting should have a label taped to the back with artist name, title, and medium. The gallery can accept 30 paintings. There is no size restriction, but extremely large pieces are discouraged. Four ribbons will be awarded. (1st, 2nd, 3rd, and Best in Show.) An article with photos will be submitted to the CDA Press.

The Angel Gallery requires:

- Each piece must be for sale.
- Originals only.
- Angel will collect a 45% commission on any sold piece.
- Artwork be brought in the morning of September 1st and remain during the entire month of September.
- They prefer the artwork be recent (painted in the last couple of years.)

- **GICLEES IN SHOWS VOTE:** The members will vote about whether or not to allow giclees in our shows. In a previous meeting, members were encouraged to express in writing their opinions. Yvonne Benzinger created a word document with the Standing Rules and proposed changes to them regarding giclees.
- **ART ON THE GREEN:**



The Art Association's annual booth at Art on the Green will be chaired by Cora Kohler-Teske, with Carol Wachter-Bettinger helping. Artists who would like to show their work must pay the \$25.00 entry fee by the next meeting July 19. We need people to work at the booth. Set-up is Thursday morning at 9:00 a.m. Paintings can be brought in to be hung Friday between 8:30 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. Artists are to bring their work and leave it for those who will hang it. We need three people per day, one to work the cash box and two to assist customers and show people the work. Sunday at 5:00 p.m. the show closes. We will need volunteers to close the booth. Artists can bring 4 8"X10" paintings, 2 11"X14" paintings or 1 16" X 20"

501c3 Application Status

The application for 501c3 non-profit status has been declined. The main reason given by the IRS was that we sell art at our shows. If the club decides to re-submit the application, we must consider making several changes to our show and club policies. One, the club would not be able to handle any sales for the artists at shows. Any artist wanting to sell art would need to be responsible for their own sales, sales tax payment, and club commission payment. Two, the club must implement more community oriented activities. The IRS thinks our club benefits members significantly more than the community. The board would like your opinion about whether to pursue this in the future. If you are interested and have opinions, please write them down and mail them to our post office box. Thank you for taking the time to consider this matter.
